Greetings, Fairies!

Thanks to your generosity and commitment to women in our community, Fairy Godmothers had another successful year. Special thanks to the Advisory Committee for their thoughtful leadership throughout 2025, including several new members who brought fresh ideas and perspectives.

Our financial position remains strong. We received \$42,290 through the 2025 Grow Green effort, raised several thousand dollars at our annual golf tournament co-hosted by the Guardians, and benefited from generous individual contributions. Our endowment now stands at nearly \$1 million, which is truly something to celebrate!

Grants continue to be the heart of our mission. Our dedicated 26-member Grants Committee carefully reviews requests and awards up to \$1,000 for emergency needs such as car repairs, dental work, and mattresses. Recipients are now eligible to reapply after three years, and we are considering increasing the maximum award. We are grateful to Shepherd's Crossing for helping streamline the application process.

The HUG (Hand Up Grant) provides scholarships up to \$3,000 to support education and career advancement. This year, in collaboration with Manhattan Area Technical College (MATC), we expanded funding to include GED programming and testing and added K-State students to our list of eligible recipients. HUG grants support students at MATC, K-State, Manhattan Christian College, and Bellus Academy.

The Advisory Committee focused on two key areas this year. First, we continued exploring ways to support childcare in our community and are now partnering with the newly launched Childcare Business Initiative, with plans to make an impact in 2026. Second, we clarified roles and responsibilities with the Greater Manhattan Community Foundation (GMCF), which manages our funds and supports fundraising, marketing, and communications. A new Memorandum of Understanding strengthens our collaboration and ensures clarity moving forward.

In addition to our work, we enjoyed gathering at the golf tournament, Wonderful Wednesday, the Lingerie Luncheon, and our annual meeting. Watch for upcoming events on Facebook, our website, and through email and mailings.

Thank you for your continued dedication to Fairy Godmothers. We look forward to another year of women helping women.

Grants Committee



In 2025, the Grants Committee awarded 64 grants totaling \$54,505. The maximum grant given was \$1000. Grants meet needs not addressed by other social service agencies and are not provided for food, lodging and utilities, legal services, car registration, or insurance. Grant monies are allocated from endowment proceeds, the Golf Tournament, and donations to the Grants Fund. We thank Shepherd's Crossing for their careful and thoughtful vetting of applicants. Grant recipients must be 18 years of age or older and be a Manhattan resident for at least one year. Applicants cannot receive a grant more often than one every three years.

Serving on the Grants Committee is very rewarding. As the first fund of the Fairy Godmothers, hundreds of women in our community have been helped, and there are many more that need our assistance. Below is just a small sampling of the stories we here.

Peggy Crubel and Usha Reddi – Co-Chairs



This grant is for a 51-year-old Riley County resident who has lived in the area for over 20 years. She lives on disability which comes out to about \$1,200. Fortunately, she also receives housing assistance, so her monthly rent is about \$200. This woman is very sick and is not able to work. A consequence of her progressing illness is that her mattress is currently unusable. She is asking the Fairy Godmothers to help her get a new mattress.

This woman is a 49-year-old single mom living in Manhattan with her two teenage daughters. She works full-time and picks up extra hours whenever possible to make ends meet. Despite a tight budget, she makes it work by relying on local food pantries, free vaccination days from K-State, Harvesters, and Common Table. She lives with a chronic immune disorder and doesn't have health insurance, but she's grateful for a compassionate doctor who helps manage her care affordably. She is seeking help to repair her car so she can continue to work.

This woman is seeking a grant for dental work. She has 17 years' experience as an LPN but developed cancer 5 years ago. Things are moving in a good direction medically, but she is struggling financially, and her savings are now depleted. Even with dental insurance, her out-of-pocket fees seem insurmountable. She expressed her gratitude for any help we could give.

The Hand Up Grant program impacted more lives this year by adding new scholarship components. In 2025 the board added the GED and driver license training as eligible scholarship areas. It made simple sense to us. If you didn't have a GED, you were limited in access to further education. If you couldn't drive your car, access to the classroom was limited.

But the stories tell it all. We had two successful Afghanistan women receive scholarships. Here is the story of one of the applicants. "I earned my MD in 2020, but everything changed with the Taliban. I worked to help over 37 Afghanistan individuals through evacuation, including their time in refugee camps and safe houses. Now in Manhattan, HUG is enabling me to become a nurse through the Manhattan Area Technical College with personal hopes to go far beyond."



We also had several single moms tell their stories. Here are excerpts from several interviews.

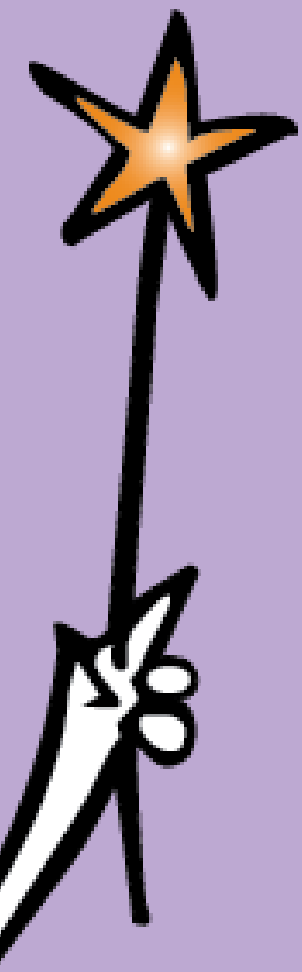
Mom 1 "As a single mother to my six-year-old son, I am pursuing higher education not only for my personal growth but to build a more secure, promising future for both of us."

Mom 2 "Almost 10 years ago, I packed a duffle bag and headed to Kansas with my 16-month-old daughter and another on the way. I had no idea where life was going to take us, and the ride has not always been fun. The HUG scholarship grant has allowed me to breathe a little lighter."

Mom 3 "I now want to dedicate my life helping mothers and babies by working the labor and delivery unit. I've dreamt about it ever since I was a little girl, but after my miscarriage I was determined and knew this is what I wanted to do."

Scholarships are available to Manhattan Area Technical College, Bellus Academy, Manhattan Christian College, and Kansas State University. Applicants simply contact Shepherd's Crossing for assistance.
