





2022 has been an exciting year for Fairy Godmothers!! We have been able to meet in person to survey our membership as we celebrate who we are, plan for the future, and share stories of our mission to enhance women in our community. As of December 2022, we remain strong with funds near \$600,000, and we continue to build our membership! Thank you to each of you for your part in the success of Fairy Godmothers this year.

We have completed a second year working with Shepherd's Crossing, giving 103 grants. Thank you to Beth Klug and Gretchen Fontanini for your support! It was a difficult decision to tighten our grant requirements, but we found so many needs and continue to give \$5,500 for grants each month. Most grants provide important services to vehicles as women must make it to work or school and take care of family. Thank you to Burnett's Auto for your partnership!! We have also worked with Beds For Less to provide mattresses and protective coverings throughout the year. This is an essential need for women and their families to protect their health and well-being.

The HUG program, with the purpose to grant scholarships for educational opportunities, continues to be important to women in the Manhattan area. This has been a successful function of Fairy Godmothers for five years, since 2018! We received an end-of-year gift in 2021 and, through a challenge, received total donations of \$25,191. We plan to give \$15,000 in scholarships during 2023.

Grow Green Match Day, sponsored by the Greater Manhattan Community Foundation, continues to be essential to our success. The Fairy Godmothers received donations of \$38,893 plus a \$10,000 match from Phil Howe for a total of \$48,893. A special thank you to each of you for your donation!

We had positive events during 2022, including:

- a Wanderful Wednesday time at Colbert Hills on August 17,
- the excellent golf tournament was enjoyed by over 100 golfers on October 3, and •
- the Lingerie Luncheon event on November 15.

#### In 2022, Fairy Godmothers Grants Committee:

- Awarded 103 grants
- Total amount of grants was \$64,746.20
- Average size of grant was \$629
- Maximum grant we give is \$800
- Most requested items were car repair, dental health, and mattresses

Grant monies were allocated by the Fairy Godmother's Advisory Board from endowment proceeds, the Golf Tournament, and ongoing donations to the Grants Fund. During 2022, we worked in partnership with Shepherd's Crossing for providing assistance to women in the Riley County area. After the Covid year there has been an increased need and we have continued conversations to make sure we are true to our original mission.

- Recipients must be 18 years of age or older
- Recipients must be Manhattan residents for at least one year
- Grants are given for a maximum of \$800
- Only one grant is provided for each recipient
- Grants are provided for needs not addressed by other social service agencies – grants are not provided for food, lodging and utilities, assistance with legal penalties, car registrations or insurance.

## Stories from Women Receiving Fairy Godmothers Grants in 2021:

This woman is divorced with two children and does not receive assistance from her ex-husband. She works parttime cleaning an office and doing some administrative work. She needs complete dentures and reports it is hard to apply for jobs while missing teeth. She and her two children moved in with her father to save on bills. She has a payment plan for the additional cost of the dentures through Konza Dental.

This 52-year-old Manhattan resident left an abusive situation over a year ago and left all her things behind. She has been trying to live within her budget and needs extra money for a new mattress and bedframe.

This grant recipient is a single woman who moved to Manhattan during Covid. She has had difficulty establishing a permanent job because of Covid-reduced hours, and then she can was unreliable. She needs her car fixed so she can return to work more permanently.

A genetic condition is affecting this Manhattan resident's teeth. She needs five crowns (\$2,450) and works part time. She and her mom are saving their money to cover the total cost of the dental work, but the FGM grant helped expedite the dental work.

The Hand Up Grant scholarship program had a rewarding year. Eight women were the recipients of your generosity. Three young women were awarded scholarships from the Manhattan Area Technical College's LPN program. With the shortage of medical personnel, I am grateful that HUG is making it possible to contribute to our community's health care. Those on the Committee gain a special bond with these students.

Additionally, at MATC, we awarded our first young woman a scholarship to complete a welding certificate. I wish every Fairy could meet her. She will be a rising star in her field, following in her grandfather's footsteps and keeping the trade alive in the family. We are especially proud to have awarded our first grant to a Manhattan Christian College student. At 50, this young woman, who cleans houses, plans on working here in our community with crisis intervention work. HUG also assisted with training two cosmetologists and launched a social worker on her way.

Happy 5-year birthday to the Hand Up Grant scholarship winners, HUG committee members, and all Fairy Godmothers for making this life-changing opportunity possible.
